#### **Groton City Council weighs infrastructure projects** amid funding challenges

By Elizabeth Varin

Several key infrastructure projects headlined discussion at Tuesday's City Council meeting.

Among pressing topics discussed was the proposal to replace the Scott Hanlon. aging city park bathroom with a comfort station, which includes both restrooms and a tornado shelter. However, federal funding may be road. harder to get, if any is available at all for a project like the comfort station.

FEMA officials announced in April that the agency was ending the sewer project. Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities program, and applications approved in fiscal years 2020-2023 were canceled. Groton officials had applied for federal emergency funds, though not through the BRIC program, said Finance Officer Douglas Heinrich. However, it isn't looking positive.

"I don't have an answer, but, if I were going to guess, I don't think they would be awarding that," he said.

Council members Brian Bahr and Karyn Babcock emphasized that FEMA.

"I personally would like to see the city wait for the rubber stamp," Bahr said, adding that a lot of work went into the proposed project, Street meet. and he doesn't want to see that go to waste.







#### Remembering Justice David Souter: The Supreme Court Could Use More Like Him

Many Americans may have missed this week the passing of Justice David Souter, who retired from the Supreme Court in 2009, after a distinguished 20-year career on the nation's High Bench, but the oversight would be understandable. After all, it's not every week, or even every century, that a sitting U.S. President publicly muses about suspending the Writ of Mandamus, known as the "Great Writ," because of its standing, as Chief Justice Salmon P. Chase declared in 1868, as "the most important human right in the Constitution," what he described as "the best and only sufficient defense of personal freedom." It's not every century that the president, in defiance of the Emoluments Clause, contemplates accepting from Qatar a luxury plane worth some \$400 million that he can use for personal matters after leaving the White House. And, of course, there's no overlooking the chaos and turbulence of the economy, which drives the citizenry to distraction.

There was much to like and admire about Justice Souter, who was just 69 when he retired from the Court. Justice Harry Blackmun told a judicial conference that Souter, "perhaps, is the only normal person on the Supreme Court." Souter never sought to make Washington, D.C. his home, nor was he seduced by the trappings of power and the social scene that captured justices and politicians, alike. He embraced a simple life and preferred the physical and cultural setting of New Hampshire--the serenity and beauty of its forests, hiking trails and, like fellow New Englander, Henry David Thoreau, time for reading and reflection. Souter lived much of his life in his maternal grandparents' home outside of Concord and moved in the latter part of his life because the structure of the house was not strong enough to bear the weight of his personal library. When he joined the Court, Souter reluctantly packed up his car, in late September before the commencement of each Term, with just a few belongings in tow, and drove to his spartan Washington apartment, already looking forward to returning to New Hampshire after the High Court had finished its business. When he retired, Justice Souter said there was more to life, than life on the Court, no matter how much he enjoyed his time on the nation's highest court.

Souter, by every measure, worked exceptionally hard. He worked in his chambers late into the evening and spent his weekends in his office. Most days, he ate lunch—a cup of yogurt and an apple, including the core—at his desk. He was an intellectual powerhouse who wrote major opinions on issues of religion, First Amendment, privacy, abortion rights, federalism, race and the structure of democracy. By historical standards, Souter was viewed as a moderate conservative jurist, committed to precedent and the rule of law. Like Justice Oliver Wendell Holmes, whose pragmatism he admired, Souter prized a modest, restrained role for the Court.

Legal scholars praised his dissent in Bush v. Gore (2000), in which the Court, in a 5-4 decision, halted Florida's recount in the contentious presidential election. He believed the Court acted without authority when it voted to terminate the recount process. As a former state supreme court justice, Souter would have given the Florida Supreme Court more time to supervise the process.

Souter's most notable opinion was likely his co-authorship in 1992, with Justices Anthony Kennedy and Sandra Day O'Connor of a ruling that reaffirmed Roe v. Wade's protection of a woman's right to terminate a pregnancy, which reflected his strong commitment to precedent. Planned Parenthood v. Casey was the Court's first opinion that recognized the relationship between reproductive rights and women's equality.

Souter's deep-seated concerns about the future of democracy were featured in a rare public interview in 2012, in Concord, before an audience of some 1,300 persons. Adam Liptak of the New York Times, in May 12 story, recounted Souter's pointed remarks about the threats to our democracy. He warned that pervasive public ignorance about the Constitution and the structure of government could give rise to an authoritarian, who would concentrate power in his hands. "That is the way democracy dies," he said. "An ignorant people can never remain a free people," Souter observed. "Democracy cannot survive too much ignorance." In various ways, until his death, Souter extolled the virtues of civic education.

PRESEASON

Week 1: VS Houston Texans (August 9, 3 pm) - Minnesota has never lost to Houston, holding a perfect record in the all-time series. In recent years, the two franchises have become surprisingly intertwined, with several players having spent time on both sides. That crossover adds an extra layer of intrigue to this early preseason matchup.

Week 2: VS New England Patriots (August 16, 12 pm) – The Vikings remain home for the second preseason game when they host the Patriots. New England's QB Drake May, the third overall pick in the 2024 draft, has a new number one WR this year after they signed former Viking Stefon Diggs.

Week 3: @ Tennessee Titans (August 22, 7 pm) – The Vikings travel to Tennessee for the final preseason game. The Titans selected QB Cam Ward with the first overall pick in last month's draft, hoping the former zero-star recruit can help them rebuild the struggling franchise.

REGULAR SEASON

Week 1: @ Chicago Bears (September 8, 7:15 pm) - The Vikings open the season on the road against a division rival on Monday Night Football. This will be a good test for Vikings' QB J.J. McCarthy, as we'll get to see how he performs in prime time against a team that, on paper, the Vikings should beat. The Vikings have a 68-58-2 record all-time against the Bears and have won 13 of the 20 games they've played this decade.

Week 2: VS Atlanta Falcons (September 14, 7:20 pm) – After a short road trip, the Vikings return home to play the Falcons on Sunday Night Football. Back-to-back prime-time games to open the season have me worried, as the Vikings historically don't fare well in those games, but this is a perfect way for the team to start re-writing that narrative. The Vikings have a 22-12 record all-time against the Falcons and have won five of the six games they've played this decade.

Week 3: VS Cincinnati Bengals (September 21, 12 pm) – The Vikings welcome Joe Burrow and the Bengals' explosive offense to US Bank Stadium. Expect a ton of scoring as the top two WRs in the NFL look to put on a show. The Vikings have a 7-8 record all-time against the Bengals and have lost two of the three games they've played this decade (both losses have been in overtime).

Week 4: @\* Pittsburgh Steelers (September 28, 8:30 am) - The Vikings head overseas to play in the first-ever NFL game at Croke Park in Dubin, Ireland. This could be the final time the Vikings face Aaron Rodgers since all signs point to him signing with the Steelers at some point. Rodgers will be looking for revenge after the Vikings declined to sign him this offseason. The Vikings have a 10-9 record all-time against the Steelers and have split the two games they've played this decade.

Week 5: @\* Cleveland Browns (October 5, 8:30 am) - The Vikings will play back-to-back games in Europe, this time at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium in London, England. Both of these overseas games are considered away games, but I expect to see plenty of purple in the stands. The Vikings have a 12-5 record all-time against the Browns and have split the two games they've played this decade.

Week 6: Bye Week – The Vikings sail home and get some much-needed rest, as the next four games will be the toughest test of the season.

Week 7: VS Philadelphia Eagles (October 19, 12 pm) – Coming off their bye week, the Vikings will host the defending Super Bowl champions in what promises to be a high-stakes showdown. The rivalry between these two teams has simmered ever since the 2017 NFC Championship Game, when the Vikings were denied a chance to play the Super Bowl in their own stadium a wound that still stings for many fans. 

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OR-DINANCE #117 AMENDMENT 5 AN ORDINANCE OF WATER AND SEWER RATES AND REGU-LATIONS FOR THE TOWN OF STRATFORD.

Notice is hereby given that Ordinance #117 Amendment 5, to update water and sewer rates and regulations, was duly adopted by the Town of Stratford on the 13th day of May 2025 and will become effective on the 11th

day of June 2025. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN OF STRATFORD, SD: SECTION 1: Ordinance 117 Amendment 5 will replace all previous water and sewer ordinances

SECTION 2 - HOOK UP CHARGE: A tapping fee of \$75 will be charged to residences, businesses, and land owners for each water main connection. An additional tapping fee of \$75 will be charged to residences, businesses and land owners for connection to city sewer lines. This fee can be paid in full immediately upon connection or, by

request, may be added to first

SECTION 3 - PUBLIC INFRA-STRUCTURE: Property owner shall provide new developments, subdivisions, and individual lots adequate water and sewer infrastructure with suitable capacity for the anticipated demand. All new principal structures must be connected to municipal sanitary sewer and water. All such expenses are the responsibility of the property owner of the proposed development. Requests for Town of Stratford infrastructure upgrade, expansion or service tie-in must be submitted for consideration to the town board for any work involving service lines.

Brown County Planning and Zoning ordinances are required for final approval (see resolution) and upon approval, the developer is responsible for all infrastructure expansion costs including specific construction requirements for the Town of Stratford which will be provided at request.

The Developer shall maintain all improvements for one year after completion as verified by the inspection of the Town of Strat-ford official. Maintenance shall be guaranteed by cash deposited with the Town of Stratford by the posting of a maintenance bond in favor of the Town of Stratford in the amount of five percent of the estimated cost of the improvements. Thereafter the Town of Stratford will assume ownership and maintenance of water and sewer services.

Property owners maintain ownership and maintenance of connections from the water main to the principal structure and from the sewer main to the

principal structure. SECTION 4 – METERS: Water meters will be read monthly on the first day of the month. Customers are responsible for any damage to their water meter or its accessories that are caused by negligence or failure to safeguard the meter and its equipment from hazards. Minimum replacement value of water meter (\$240) plus applicable plumbing fees with be included on customer's regular invoice following completion of

necessary work. SECTION 5 - PROPERTY CLASSIFICATION AND FEES

Primitive: No water or sewer infrastructure available: \$0/mo

Preconstruction: Existing infrastructure present but meter/ plumbing work required for service: \$30/mo

SECTION 6 - BILLING AND PAYMENTS: Bills will be issued monthly no later than the 15th of the month and will be due a minimum of 2 weeks after the date of invoice. If an account reaches 30 days past due, the town may at its discretion disconnect the water service and regular fees will continue to accrue. Service may not be restored until the account is paid in full.

SECTION 7 – SERVICE FEES: A fee of \$25 will be charged for any disconnection or reconnection of service whether it be from delinquent account or temporary disconnection by request.

Dear EarthTalk: How big a role has corruption played in slowing the global fight to combat climate change, and what's being done to increase transparency? Horace Wilson, Miami, FL

Climate change is a pressing problem worldwide, and yet corruption continues to obstruct significant progress. Corruption is defined as the abuse of entrusted power for private gain. Powerful industries, and the people they fund, often spread misinformation and lobby at meetings with world leaders to obstruct policy decisions. Governmental bribery and fraud lead to the misuse of money meant for climate protection. All these forms of corruption cost billions of dollars and potentially thousands of lives.

Some of the largest backers of climate corruption are large fossil fuel companies. A haviors and makes recommendations to stakeholders study by Transparency International (TI) in January 2024 found that seven major Big Oil companies had a total lobbying budget of 64 million Euros, and attended more than 1,000 meetings with the European Commission, mostly concerned with Green Deal policies.

Big Oil networks hold power by hiring former government officials and funding large events and research institutions. Lobbying and bribery lead to weak environmental policies, and corruption feeds the illegal trade of animals and other wildlife crimes.

Climate change and fraud have a reciprocal relationship. Studies show that climate-induced disasters can lead to greater corruption. After a natural disaster, a country will often receive money and other resources, which officials could deliberately misuse. Exacerbated by the quick response that disaster relief requires, less thorough oversight over funds can result in wasted money, worsening the effects on communities.


TI's Corruption Perception Index (2024) and the ND-GAIN measurement of climate readiness were analyzed together and showed a correlation, where countries with worse corruption had worse climate readiness, especially pronounced in developing areas such as East Asia, South Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean. In these countries, environmental defenders also face a higher risk of being murdered.

The interplay of corruption and climate change can seem overwhelming, but there are groups and people fighting for protection. As Drs. Gvantsa Gverdtsiteli and Roberto Kukutschka stated for TI, "Making sure that as many impacted people as possible are involved in climate projects and weeding out undue influence is key to their success." The National Whistleblower Center protects and rewards whistleblowers who expose corruption via legal assistance, policy promotion and public education. For those who need help against corruption, the Targeting Natural Resource Corruption Consortium provides resources. TI's work includes a Climate and Corruption Atlas, which tracks and analyzes corruption cases across the world. On the local level, groups should seek to engage communities in disaster relief to better tailor the funding solutions, as well as increase public availability of both climate and financial data...



#### Shed Those Fears of Cancer Treatment

Mrs. B came into the emergency room one night, years ago, with some stress related issue. After taking her history, I began to suspect there was something else bothering her. As I was beginning her physical exam she blurted out, "I know there is a breast



mass but you're not going to send me to any breast cancer doctor!" She had already decided to avoid standard treatment and her next comment explained why, "My aunt suffered because of awful unnecessary surgery and chemotherapy," she said. I sensed there was no changing her mind and that meant trouble for my patient.

The story evolved as my patient's breast cancer grew and eroded through her skin to become a weeping and tender sore. She soon sought out unconventional treatment by a non-physician from a neighboring town with an internet degree of some kind who promised to help her. The treatment involved a curious machine with flashing lights and an unusual noise which apparently indicated which group of herbal supplements the patient needed to buy in order to cure the cancer "naturally."

More women are diagnosed with breast cancer than any other malignancy, except for skin cancer. If the breast cancer hasn't spread outside of breast tissue, then, with treatment, the five-year survival is about 99 percent. If the cancer has spread to lymph nodes just outside the breast, then, with treatment, the five-year survival is about 90 percent. Even if the cancer has spread to distant parts of the body, which happens only in about six percent of the cases, then, with treatment, more than 25 percent are still alive after five years. Since 1989, the number of people who die from breast cancer has been steadily decreasing which is the direct result of improved methods for breast cancer screening, detection and treatment.

My patient died less than a year from our meeting in the emergency room. I still regret not convincing her to get help from a science-based breast cancer physician. She may have lived years longer and in more comfort. Many people are now being saved who were previously lost to all types of cancers. Even when lifesaving is not possible, current cancer treatment can at least improve the quality of the time that remains.

Bottom line: The fear of death and the fear of suffering keep some people from seeking medical help. Please shed those fears and seek science-based help.
