# Thorson denied Sabbatical Leave for "Alaskan Adventure"

Scott Thorson has requested a Sabbatical Leave starting at the end of December and would return in time to teach in the 2014-15 school year. His request was to go on a learning trip that would enhance his classroom teaching and would have an entire unit over the "Alaskan Adventure." Thorson came before the board Monday night to outline his proposal.

He said that about a year ago, he was watching a show entitled, "Great Teachers" where teachers explore real life learning rather than getting college credits or internet. Thorson said he did some researching and phone calling. Then two weeks ago, ASRC Energy Services, Anchorage, Alaska, called and said there may be an opportunity for Thorson. Camp in Prudhoe Bay has an opening for this type of experience. He would be working in Kuparuk, Alaska, which is where the beginning of the Alaskan Oil Pipeline is at.

There are three possible opportunities that would await Thorson. One is pipeline maintenance. A second is driving trucks and delivering materials throughout the region (ice road truckers). The third is environmental control - making sure habitat of the region are protected as well as workers from them. The work schedule is usually two or three weeks on, two or three weeks off.

Thorson said he has everything lined up for the substitute and he would still go on the junior class trip and coordinate fund raising events.

Superintendent Joe Schwan said that the district would need a "highly qualified standard" teacher to fill in. If someone does not meet those standards, then a letter would be sent home to the parents of the student stating so.

Board member Kelly Kjelden said, "I feel it's a big decision for me on the board. It's a lot, it's big and it's fast and it's not my style." The short notice was a concern for the board members. Board President Dorene Nelson said it's a difficult decision considering the circumstances. "The last time we had a request for Sabbatical Leave was from Loren Locken." Board member Steven Smith said, "We, as a board, don't know who these candidates are," referring to those who would possibly fill in for Thorson during his absence. "We have to make sure the kids are taken care of," said Board Member Marty Weismantel. At that point, the board decided to go into executive session to discuss personnel matters.

After the board came out of executive session, the board voted unanimously to deny Thorson's request for Sabbatical Leave. The board members conveyed the feeling that there would not be enough academic benefit for the trip.

Joe Schwan reported on the new governor's proposal to increase spending to secondary education. This year he is planning for a 3 percent increase which is above the 1.8 percent that was set by law. In addition, he proposes that the minimum yearly proposal would be 2 percent.

The district survey results were reviewed. There were 190 responses to the survey. Schwan said they will use the information to see what areas can be improved.

Work is currently underway in developing a shared vision and mission of the athletic program to help improve the program. Five coaches, the athletic director and a board member will be on the board to discuss options. They hope to have something by the end of the school year to present to the school board. "I think we can see some good things from this," Schwan said.

Allison Weber will be competing today in a business contest in Aberdeen. She is one of

eight finalists in the running to win \$1,000 with her business, "Doggie Spaw."

The three that went to the state oral-interp over the weekend were Jocelyn Peterson who earned a superior, and Lily Cutler and Olivia Lone who both finished excellent.

High School/Middle School Principal Anna Schwan talked about Middle School Ineligibility. "The policy is there, but we'll be following it more closely. So far, so good on day one."

The middle/high school concert is Thursday at 7 p.m.

Elementary students will be singing at the Golden Living center on December 12 and at Sun Dial Manor in Bristol on Dec. 13, both at 2 p.m.

There was discussion on a change order of \$29,960 in work done on the 1968 addition roofing project. Of that, there is an \$11,400 charge for poor workmanship of the skylights. There was a question of which way to go with the cost of the attorney. The board agreed to have the attorney draft a letter and to settle for half.

Duane Kavanaugh has resigned as the head girls soccer coach as he and Val have now moved out to Rapid City.

Brooke Lingbeck was hired as a special education paraprofessional at \$12 and hour for seven hours a day at the high school, effective January 6, 2014.

The bus bids were reviewed and the bid opening was set for January 13, 2014.

One of the healthcare plans does not meet the spec of ObamaCare and had to be adjusted. That will mean a 6 percent increase for the four people on that plan effective January 1, 2014.

There was a request from St. John's Lutheran Church to use the district's sound equipment. Reid Johnson has offered to move the equipment to install and handle it. The board agreed to rent out the equipment. A \$150 deposit will be required and the deposit will be returned as long as the equipment comes back undamaged.

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

NOTICE OF HEARING OF THE THE BROWN COUNTY COMMISSION

REGARDING AN AMENDMENT TO SECOND REVISION BROWN COUNTY ORDINANCE, TITLE 4

A public hearing will be held by the Brown County Commission on the 17th day of December 2013 beginning at 8:45 a.m. in the Commission Chambers, Courthouse Annex, to consider an ordinance amending Second Revision Brown County Ordinances, Title 4, specifically amending Chapter 4.13 Commercial District (C), Section 4.1302 Permitted Principal Uses and Structures Paragraph 4 strike - excluding any warehousing and storage services;

Section 4.1304 Special Exceptions Paragraph 5 add - General Warehousing and Storage; Section 4.1306 Minimum Yard Requirements add - There shall be a front yard of not less than a depth of ten (10) feet. There shall be a rear yard of not less than ten (10) feet. Each side yard shall not be less than five (5) feet as measured from the outermost edge of structures. All distances are measured from the lot lines; Section 4.1307 Maximum Lot Coverage add - Minimum off-street parking and loading requirements shall also be considered for lot coverage based on use.

The public is invited to attend the hearing and to present comments and testimony regarding the amendment to Title 4, Chapter 4.13 Commercial District (C), Section's 4.1302, 4.1304, 4.1306 and 4.1307. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Brown County Commission may adopt first reading of Brown County Ordinance No. 083.
