Polar Vortex Hits Area With Frigid Temperature

It was described as a Polar Vortex, a center of very cold air coming down from the north, that made temperatures plunge to way below zero and wind chill factors at below -40.

The cold weather prompted several area churches to cancel worship services on Sunday and all area schools were called off on Monday.

It was a balmy Friday as the temperature soared to 37.7 degrees at 10:23 p.m., but then the temperature started falling throughout the day on Saturday. The daytime high was 17.1 at midnight and had fallen to -10.8 during the night with the windchill factor at -22.8.

The temperature continued to nose dive on Sunday with the daytime high of -7.7, a low of -18.9 with a wind chill of -41.4.

Monday's temperature rose to -8 with a low of -22.1 and windchill factor of -40.5.

The Polar Vortex exited the area with a south wind bringing in warmer air. Later in the week, daytime highs will be a balmy 30 degrees above zero.

Rubble Site Fees Increasing

The rubble site fees for 2014 will be increasing. The new fee structure was approved at the city council meeting Monday. One-time loads will increase from \$5 to \$10, household season pass will increase from \$30 to \$35, one-time commercial will from \$15 to \$20, grass only season pass will increase from \$100 to \$125 and commercial season pass will increase from \$150 to \$175. The sales tax will be included in those fees. In the past year, the rubble site lost \$19,475.09, mostly due to extra maintenance on the trees which amounted to \$14,707.43, and a one-time installation fee of the rubble site gate of \$7,177.53. It was also pointed out that the revenue from the sale of clay that is being stored at the rubble site was around \$25,000 with all of those funds going into the general fund none for the rubble site fund. No effective date was set on the fees, so they will go into effect 20 days after publication of the minutes.

Krueger Brothers were awarded the gravel bids at \$16.94 per yard. The outbid Hanlon Brothers by six cents.

Two bids for a skidsteer were reviewed. One was from JGross Equipment in the amount of \$44,386.00 which included \$18,000 for the trade-in of the city's Mustang. The other was from Butler Cat for \$63,844.12 with no allowance listed for a trade-in. The Butler Cat bid was also for a different machine than what was test driven. The bids were tabled until some of the questions can be answered such as warranty, trade-in allowance, etc.

The council gave approval for a Mud Creek Water Flow Study to be done on city property. Helms and Associates will be doing the study being paid for by the James River Water District and the Mud Creek Water District. This study is being done on the south edge of Groton.

The second reading of the personnel manual was approved and the council was encouraged to attend Legislative Day February 4-5 in Pierre.

A question about when the ice skating rink should be open during the cold weather. Instead of listing a policy, the council agreed to let Justin Olson, skating rink manager, and Paul Kosel determine when the rink should be closed due to cold weather.
