## Blizzards blasts Dakotas

The Carnival of Silver Skates scenery remained standing after a 48 mph gust hit Groton Sunday afternoon at 3:12.

At first, the Carnival was scheduled to go on as planned at 2 p.m.; however, the sunny sky and light wind changed as the low pressure system passed through Groton on its trek to the southeast. Once it passed through, the wind picked up and the one inch of snow that fell during the morning hours was lifted in the air. By 12:44 p.m., the Silver Skates committee decided to call off the 2 p.m. performance as well, after earlier canceling the evening performance. Visibility was reduced to zero and the temperature started to drop, resulting in subzero wind chill factors. The event has been canceled only two other times in its 76-year history. The most recent was three years ago due to unseasonably warm temperature that melted the ice.

The Carnival of Silver Skates will be held on Sunday, Feb. 2, with a single 1 p.m. performance. Practices will be held again on Saturday at the usual time.

The blizzard warning was activated at 6 a.m., but it did not really hit until closer to noon. Weather forecasters did say that there would be a delay in the blizzard.

By mid afternoon on Sunday, I-29 was closed from Sioux Falls to the Canadian border.

Northwestern Energy reported that eight power poles were blown down in the Faulkton area and the town of Faulkton was without power for a short period of town. Also, Huron and Avon reported power outages from the blizzard.







## Board agrees to discuss GPD office at GHS

The safety of the students and faculty members was brought up by Superintendent Joe Schwan. He has been brainstorming about ideas. He said for the district to have a school resource officer is not financially feasible. "We have four certified law officers in Groton," he said. "Wouldn't it be nice if we could partner with the Groton Police Department so that our school is the safest place in town?"

Schwan's idea is to allow the police department to be housed at the high school with an outside entry. "The officers could be doing their paperwork here. Just having them here is really important and it's just nice to have their vehicle parked out front." The discussion has not begun with the city, yet. "I wanted to find out if this is something we should open a dialog with the city about," he said. "It would be nice for us to be proactive to support school safety," said board member Kelly Kjelden. Board member Steve Smith asked why the high school building instead of the elementary school. Schwan said room is a consideration. There is no room to give up at the elementary school. The board agreed to have Schwan open a dialog with the city about this possibility.

Board President Dorene Nelson emotionally read the resignation/retirement letter from Nancy Cutler. She is the elementary technology director and Rtl director. She will be retiring at the end of this school year. As will Jana Duncan as the middle school science/social studies teacher. Nelson had Joe Schwan read Duncan's letter of resignation/retirement effective at the end of this school year.

Also resigning at the end of this school year are Malerie Yeaton in music and Shauna Remily as the first grade teacher. Jim Gerdes will be resigning as the afternoon bus driver in the first part of February. Bus driving assignments were approved for Don Donley and Butch Farmen.

Two events had to be rescheduled due to a dance recital scheduled for the same day as the spring concert. The FCCLA Style show will be moved up one week to May 1 and the MS/HS Spring Concert will be moved up to May 8.

Don Donley talked about the technology courses that he teaches. There are 48 students involved in technology. He noted there are two teams in the Robotics competition, up from the one team last year. The state competition is March 8th and he said that no matter what happens at state, Groton's teams will not be going any further because it's the same time as prom.

Lindsey Tietz talked about the FACS classes this year and she noted that the numbers are up this year compared to last year. FACS III has come back and there are eight students enrolled. She thanked the board for providing up-to-date equipment and tools for her program. She said that not all school districts have current equipment.

Adam Franken talked about the ag department. Classes are broken down into semester classes as follows: Horticulture/Greenhouse Technology, Ag Marketing and Sales/Agribusiness Entrepreneurship, Plant Science/Animal Science, Wildlife and Fisheries/Ag Processing, and Introduction to Agriculture is a year-round class. There are 85 to 90 students enrolled in agriculture classes.

Soccer next year will be divided into two classes as more teams are getting involved in the sport. There will be a shot clock in basketball starting next year.

Superintendent Joe Schwan talked about the school calendar with the district missing four full days, had three early dismissals and two 2-hour late starts. Decisions will be made in February to decide how to handle the missed hours of school.

Schwan talked about trips that students are taking. He said just this school year, the amount of money fund-raised and used from families amounted to \$137,000 for trips. He said the district should evaluate the trip-policy.

The elementary numbers have gone up by three since last month with a new student in each of the second, third and fourth grades. A family moved into the Columbia area. Elementary Principal Dan Dalchow reported that the elementary book fair is set for February 14, the elementary boys basketball tourney is March 1 and the elementary carnival is March 29. The next Elementary PAC sponsored Children's Theater is set for March 22-28, 2015.

High/Middle School Principal Anna Schwan reported on the state FCCLA qualifiers. The district was held January 17 and those qualifying for state are Tia Thompson, Keri Pappas, Audrey Wanner, Katie Koehler, Jazzmine Hinman, Emily Locke, Paityn Bonn and LaTasha Mehlhaff.

The Augustana Chorus will be on tour and will be in Groton February 4 at 1:30 p.m. for the middle school and high school chorus.

Friday is the earliest anyone can take out a petition for city council or school board.

There was a request to purchase some property that the district is currently not using by the bus barns. Joe Schwan said, "I don't think it's in the district's best interest to sell property. Once it's gone, you can't get it back," he said. Steve Smith said it could create issues down the road if the district decides to build a bigger shop. The board is not interested in selling.

The heaters in the bathrooms in the gym are not working. Kevin Nehls from Johnson Controls offered some heaters at 10 percent below cost as they were for another project and were not wanted. The cost would be \$1,600. The board agreed to buy the heaters.
