New baseball league could be in Groton's future

The 12, 10 and 8 and under baseball teams may soon be part of a new league. Sisseton, Groton, Wilmot, Milbank, Webster, Britton and possibly two other towns will form a new league. Some of the games will be played in Webster as a middle point for the furtherest teams. The games will also be played on a timed basis instead of number of innings. Also under consideration is paying the base umpires \$15 per game and the umpire behind the plate \$20 per game. There are a number of details that need to be worked out

The Groton City Council has a new look with two new members taking their seats on the 127th council. Clare Brotherton did not seek re-election. She has served on the council for eight years, taking over the position vacated by her late husband. Bill Brotherton, who served

her late husband, Bill Brotherton, who served on the council for 12.5 years. David Blackmun, Jr., took her spot on the council. Gary Heitmann has been on the council for 14 years. Taking his spot is Burt Glover. Mayor Scott Hanlon

said, "We would like to thank Clare and Gary for all the time they have dedicated to the city of Groton. Thank you very much."

David McGannon will be the board president and Michelle Muilenberg will be the vice president. Anita Lowary as appointed as finance officer and Drew Johnson was appointed as the city attorney.

During the discussion of the bills, the bill from Aberdeen Asphalt was brought up. It amounted to \$10,753.34, which is about double of the original estimate. "We found a lot more cracks than anticipated," Mayor Hanlon said. "It had to be done and it looks like they did a good job."

Terry Herron and Dwight Zerr were recognized by the South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources for having good drinking water in Groton. To be recognized by the state, they have to meet the following requirements for 10 consecutive years: Compliance monitoring and reporting, drinking water standards and certification requirements. "It's nice to know we have good drinking water," Mayor Hanlon said. In a letter from DENR Secretary Steve Pirner, he said, "DENR is proud to honor the City of Groton and their operation specialists who have kept the water flowing, safe and in full compliance for 13 consecutive years. Water is always a precious commodity, but having water delivered to our homes suitable for drinking and all other household use is just awesome."

On June 2 at 6 p.m., City Finance Officer Anita Lowary, Mayor Scott Hanlon and City Attorney Drew Johnson will meet with Mike Olson prior to the Groton City Council meeting to discuss options.

The delinquent utility customer list was discussed. The first round of shut-offs will be done if the bills are not paid on time.

The Fliehs plat was approved by the city council. Mary Fliehs divided her one big property into two smaller lots and then sold the east one to Robert Wegner who is building a new house on that lot.

After an executive session, the council accepted the resignation of Nick Weber as pee wee/midget coach and groundskeeper.


Principal's Middle School 8th Grade Honor Roll
