

Bath Fire Station gets pumper truck

Upgrading the Bath Fire Station has moved a step closer for the Groton Fire District with the purchase of a pumper truck. The truck was purchased from the Aberdeen Fire Department for \$10,000.

The truck has been housed at the Bath Station and training on the new pumper is being organized. There is still some work needed on the truck, such as stenciling and retooling the radios. Groton Fire Chief, Dion Bahr will see to the needed work.

Bahr proposed a motion from the Groton Firemen to purchase a new 6-wheeler to be used on grass fires. The Groton Fire board would pay \$5,000 towards the purchase and the firemen would pay the rest of the proposed \$23,000. The board approved the purchase. It will join an older 6-wheeler and a 4-wheeler already owned by the department. There was some discussion on stationing the 4-wheeler at the Bath Station is room allowed.

Bahr also reported that during a recent controlled burn, used as a training event, the older 6-wheeler was damaged. It seems that over the years, dried grass and corn stalks had accumulated under the seat and a spark caught fire, causing a smoldering fire that damaged the air intake and shifting wires. The vehicle is being fixed.

Each year the fire department receives requests for the department to do control burns for property owners. Bahr asked the board for clarification on the board policy on these burns. The board left the right to turn down burns up to the fire chief. He will have the final say in whether the burn can be used as training or not. The property owner would be required to cover costs and sign a liability waiver for any burns conducted by the fire department.

The county has asked fire departments to report how many bottles of SCBA's they may need. The county then orders them at a reduced rate. Bahr said that Groton will need at least three or four bottles. The expected cost will be around \$1,000 per bottle. The bottles are only good for so long and some of the ones Groton has are nearing their end date. SCBA stands for Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus.

Board member Dale Ringgenberg reported for the Groton Rescue Squad during the board meeting. He said that due to a shortage of funds, Stanford will soon stop offering free training for the rescue squad personal, as members are required to maintain so many training hours, an alternative solution may be required. One option is to have a training officer, this would be a paid position due to the hours required. The board will look at this option when the time comes.

Ringgenberg also reported that the department may try out a new pager system. The system uses a phone app that would allow responders to see who is responding to calls. The system is free to try for 60 days, after that it is \$800 a month. Both rescue and fire will use the system.

Rescue is still having a problem finding enough people to respond to calls. Some calls are answered by only one person, while other calls have plenty of responders; it all depends on the time of the day and the nature of the call. More applications are being taken.

Climate Prediction Center says Cool Wet Weather Ahead

BROOKINGS, S.D. - More cool and wet weather across South Dakota are likely this summer according to the latest outlook from the Climate Prediction Center of NOAA.

"This condition will have some interesting implications for South Dakota and the region particularly because of the cool spring," said Dennis Todey, SDSU Extension State Climatologist.

Although corn planting has moved along near average pace to this point in the spring for South Dakota, Todey said emergence is behind the 5-year average. "While this is not a major issue currently, the potential lack of heat during the summer could change the potential crop situation across the state as the summer progresses," he said.

Typically, crops in the southeast part of the state, often experience enough heat during an average growing season. Todey indicated that more frequent 90-degree days often leads to crop stress. "The potential for cool weather during this summer would likely be favorable to their growing season reducing some potential stress," Todey said.

He added that the cooler conditions in the northern portion of the state could produce some additional problems with corn and soybeans. "Northeastern parts of the state generally are more heat-limited. Cooler conditions during the summer could slow crop development throughout the year," he said. "The final impact of cooler temps is not likely to be limited yields, but will be either crops which will not be completely mature at harvest, or contain too high moisture."

Similar problems are likely across the northern tier of the Corn Belt where Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin and North Dakota are all well behind on corn planting currently, said Laura Edwards, SDSU Extension Climate Field Specialist.

"These states are not the biggest producers of corn and soybeans. But collectively, they represent a large chunk of acres which could have delayed crop problems throughout the year," she said.

For small grains, Edwards explained that the cooler conditions should have less of an impact other than potentially delaying maturity and harvest. "Cooler conditions should be generally favorable for small grains once planted," she said.

She added that because wetter than average conditions are more likely throughout most of the state, for areas south and west this also should be generally beneficial. "Even if wetter than average conditions do not pan out, the cooler temperatures would help overall soil moisture conditions," Edwards said. "Cooler conditions reduce crop water use. Thus, less moisture would be needed even in drier soils."

The long range outlooks are also interesting, Todey added, because the Climate Prediction Center rarely says much about temperature or precipitation in the northern plains during the summer months. "The current outlooks are not indicating wet or cool conditions strongly. But that they indicate anything different from equal chances is an interesting feature of the outlooks," he said.

Why cooler and wet conditions?

Part of the reasoning behind the change, Todey explained seems to be the development of the current El Nino. "Warmer than average sea-surface temperatures have developed rapidly in the equatorial Pacific leading to a quickly developing El Nino," he said.

Recent numbers from the Climate Prediction Center have noted a 65 percent chance of El Nino developing this summer. This situation has impacted the potential outlooks over South Dakota and the Corn Belt for the summer.

Spring clean-up returns to Groton

Councilman David McGannon expressed concern about the stack of pictures that were taken by the police department referring to the clean-up that the council is trying to accomplish. "We need a place for the people to put their stuff," he said at the meeting Monday night. "They can't take it to the dump and they're not suppose to take it to the dumpsters."

The reason that spring clean-up was done away with was because of the road conditions in town. The city would take advantage of the free dumping at the county landfill for the city's clean-up, but the timing was not working with road conditions. The council decided to bring back the spring clean-up from June 12-17. The location of the dumpster is still uncertain as two sites along Sixth Street are under consideration.

This will be the last week that residents have to haul their garbage to designated locations. Starting next Tuesday, May 27, regular curbside pickup of garbage will resume.

An update of the Groton Swimming Pool was provided and as of Monday night, things are looking up for the pool to be open by May 25 for staff re-certification and then opening for the public on May 26. The pumps were turned on after the council meeting and the initial tests reflect good chemistry at this point. The

pool is nearly full and the boiler is expected to be turned on Tuesday morning.

The city was notified on Friday that it was awarded a second Broadband grant. This grant will bring wireless internet to the community center as well as to the rubble site gate and to the north substation. The grant amounted to around \$4,000.

Holes are expected to be drilled at the park on Thursday for the foundation of the new playground equipment. Joe Foertsch is spearheading the effort to install the equipment.

Any decision on the flowers at the cemetery was tabled to the June 2 meeting. The council had agreed to have the flowers removed from the cemetery on June 15. Issues such as moving and trimming around the flowers and keeping the cemetery looking good were discussed. Some places have a lot of decorations, but are not cared for by the families and as a result, weeds two to three feet tall grow up in those areas. "We don't need to rush into a decision right now," McGannon said. "I think we should wait until after Memorial Day to make a decision." Councilman Mary Fliehs had suggested allowing the flowers to stay until Labor Day.

Breanna Woods does not have her certi-

fication for serving food yet and will have to go to Sioux Falls to take a one-day course. She is the new food provider at the baseball complex. The council agreed to reimburse Woods for the costs of the certification at the end of the season.

Peggy Locke and Anita Lowary were authorized to attend the Finance Officer's School and Human Relations School in Oacoma.

Malt beverage licenses were renewed for Ken's Food Fair and Duane's Sinclair.

After an executive session, the council hired Adam Herman as a baseball groundskeeper and assistant peewee coach and accepted the resignation of Travis Kurth as Park Superintendent effective June 2.
