

Legion numbers are down

As of the city council meeting Monday night, there were only seven players signed up for Legion baseball this year. The consensus among the parents is that they still want all three teams Legion, Teeners and Junior Teeners. Bary Keith was hired as a Teener coach and Mason Madsen as the junior teener coach. An effort to recruit more players will be made.

This particular meeting is when the new council takes over and with that, David McGannon was voted as council president and David Blackmun as council vicepresident. Anita Lowary was appointed as the finance officer and Drew Johnson the city attorney.

Wastewater, cemetery, civil defense, community center: Mary Fliehs as chairman, Eddy Opp as co-chairman.

Finance office, legal, library, insurance, general administration, elections, code enforcement: Jay Peterson as chairman, David Blackmun as co-chairman.

Solid waste, rubble site, parks, forestry, liquor: Eddy Opp as chairman, Burt Glover as cochairman.

Police: Mayor Scott Hanlon NECOG Representative: Jay

Planning and Zoning Representative: David Blackmun

Ross Buntrock from Buntrock Auction Service came before the council to request the alley behind Clarie Cowan's place be closed off for the auction set for June 13 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The request was not put on the agenda so the council did not act on it. The decision will be made at the next council meeting.

Jennifer Sietsema from Northeast Council of Government will be on hand at the next council meeting to talk about the city's mitigation strategy and planning for the future.

The Fiedler-Rix plat was approved.

Dirk Rogers, Brown County Highway Superintendent, appeared before the council to talk about the Railroad Avenue work that needs to be done this year. The South Dakota Department of Transportation is recommending certain work to be done to make it ready for the SD3/ bypass in 2016. It is suggested that one foot of material be removed, putting in new material and then a 4' asphalt mat. The asphalt would cost \$180,000. The city has a \$200,000 Community Access Grant that could be used for the project; however, it is not known if those funds will be used for this project as the state may flip the bill. Brown County is short of funds to do all of its highway projects. Rogers said there are 500 miles of asphalt roads in Brown County with 180 of those miles in complete failure. The city's share of the project would be the grant,

if used, and some fill dirt. Job descriptions were reviewed for the public works department. They will be put into official form and presented at a future meet-

The baseball fence is up and the slats will be put in this week.

They will be a Legion Blue color in the outfield. It was noted that only the corner posts are installed with a concrete base. The rest of the posts are pushed into the ground at three and one-half feet. A sign will be put either in the back of the Grandstand or on the concession stand listing the state champions.

There was discussion on the pool fundraiser. The ad in the paper states that David McGannon was the leader, but as of 4 p.m., the new leader is Marc Sippel for the first person to go down the slide.

A port-a-potty will be put at the Groton Cemetery.

A request for a four-way stop sign at Fourth Avenue and Third Street was denied.

The addition to the runway at the Groton Airport will be seeded by John Knoltner at a cost of \$1,800, which includes mulch.

There was consideration of having a water restriction ordinance, but the council decided not to add that ordinance to the books. As in the past, the mayor and the water superintendent will determine when there will be water restrictions, which would be no watering from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

council hired Dan Sonne from Milbank as the new electric linemen at a rate of \$28 an hour. He will also be given up to \$2,000 in moving allowance to relocate to Groton.

The potholes will soon go away. It was reported that patching will be done in the next week or so.

In my 20's you wouldn't have seen me holding anything with small print as far away from my eyes as my arms could reach just so I could see the small stinking print that is way smaller than it used to be. In my 20's you wouldn't have run across my rather impressive collection of magnifying glasses and you wouldn't have noticed the silver sparkle that has decided to illuminate my hair. I've heard people say they would do things a lot different if they had the chance to start over but I don't think I would. Everything I've experienced has taught me something. It's unfortunate to a point, I suppose, but the bad experiences have taught me the most.

In almost 50 years there are lots of things I've learned that have benefited me tremendously but the one I treasure most is the one that taught me God's plan was just a tad bit different than mine. I had no desire to go to college. I had no desire to pursue any type of professional career. I wanted to be wife and mother. I practiced being a mom for years. I drove my parents crazy because all I ever wanted for my birthday or for Christmas was, as my dad would put it, another dang doll! God knew this but He had a slightly different plan. It wasn't an easy one to grasp and there were times I really wanted a better answer to my "whys" but I can't say I'd change the way things turned out.

I wasn't able to give birth or experience motherhood first hand. During the years of trying to make this happen, all nine of them, I cried more than I thought a person could cry. I found out what depression was. I found out what acceptance was but in the process a rather hard shell formed around my heart when it came

to children. It was my way of protecting something that had already ached more than I believed it should have ever had to. I had no idea fate had plans of removing that shell nor did I know how it would go about it. All I knew was I had to endure a very painful divorce, move back home and get a job working a ton of hours while trying to sort out all the things that went wrong over the course of twenty years. It was then fate began knocking down that very hard shell by using the warmth and love of some very amazing children I would see everyday at the convenience store where I worked. Their school bus stopped there to pick them up but we always had time to visit before they left for the day. I had no idea what was happening but eventually I found myself bonding with some of the kindest and most beautiful young people on the face of this earth. We would gather around the till and talk about all the exciting things that were happening in their lives. Sometimes I would bring treats and offer advice when someone was being picked on or not feeling the best.

There was one young girl that divulged how scared she was walking those two blocks to the store every morning because it was dark outside. I remember being scared of the dark and I would never have wanted to walk by myself in the dark for two blocks when I was her age so I had a little chat with her dad after she left. He shrugged it off as her being silly but he did start giving her a ride after that. She thanked me.


One little first grade girl always had a way of tickling me with her innocence and I still enjoy those memories. One day she was standing near the till when an adult was checking out. The pen holder on the counter was empty again and I said, "I can't believe how many pens grow legs and walk right out that door!" She pondered for a bit and then in a very serious way she said, "Do the pens really grow legs and walk out of here?"

Three young kids that had been staying at their grandparent's house over the weekend came bursting in the door one morning, all excited to tell me their grandpa and grandma's cat had her kittens! I asked how they knew and they said, "Well, because she doesn't look like a soccer ball this morning!" I would venture to say mama cat was most likely black and white. Wouldn't you?

I also had the chance to go to movies with some of them and take some of them out for supper and there was one, in particular, that owns the most pieces of that shell I wore around my heart. She chose to spend as much of her free time with me as she could, even when I was in a bad mood. Often times I would ask her why she liked me even when I was crabby and she would always say, "Because you're Bev." How many adults would say that? She is more precious than some of the people in her life will ever realize or give her credit for. She's resilient. She's beautiful inside and out and mature beyond her years but that doesn't mean she won't make wire loops and homemade bubble solution with me so I can look less silly when I want to be amazed by bubbles. I'm thinking she would even be okay with me telling people it was her idea!

One evening she and I were visiting and on the way to her house we drove past a lot where a house had burned a few years ago. She said her friend told her she was in that house when it started on fire. I said, "Really?" And then she said, "No, she wasn't and I didn't believe her anyway." I asked why not and she said, "She also told me she was a mermaid." You've got to love a kid blessed with a healthy dose of common sense!

Retiring boomers: benefit or burden?

As Baby boomers are coming-of-age, that is, of retirement age... what is going to happen? Starting nine months after soldiers of WWII came home to the US, there was a birth rate boom that has and continues to profoundly affect our culture. Baby boomers born from 1946 to 64, almost as a celebration of soldier survival, grew up as the richest and most privileged group of all time.

Often raised with a soldier-disciplined father and a not-quite-happy-work-at-home mother, boomers grew up watching too much TV, listening to Beach Boys and Beatles on transistor radios, and expecting more privilege to come. Boomer attitudes came out of a successful economy and a significant postwar social subsidy.

Graduating from Easy-&-Perfect-Boomer High, they were shocked into reality by the draft, Vietnam, and inequality between sexes and races. This spoiled '50's sit-com generation of sex, drugs, and rock-n-roll, grew into an angry government-distrusting counter-culture that fought for social justice causes like feminism, civil rights, an end to

the Vietnam War, all reflecting the right of individual choice.

These children of privilege and excess, as adults distrust institutions and crave control of their own and the collective fate. It is no surprise this group has also achieved the most wealth. Although accounting for 24% of the total US population, boomers hold onto something like 80% of the wealth of our country, account for 80% of all leisure travel, dole out 50% of all consumer spending and yet only provide 43% of all charitable giving. This would suggest some distrust of big charities as well as big government.

And now 76 million 51-69 year olds are a cultural demographic coming to retirement age, with a smaller cadre of youth to care for them as they eventually become very elderly and disabled unto death. How does our society prepare for this potential societal burden?

I predict that very old boomers won't be such a burden, as research finds 60% of those aged 85 or older do not experience significant memory loss, 75% still drive, 70% are not depressed, and in general the aged are as happy as any group. 
And, oh, in these next years as boomers have more time on their hands, expect an increasing demand for social justice.



THINKING ABOUT HEALTH **Long-Term Care Hits a Nerve for Many**

By Trudy Lieberman, Rural Health News Service Readers have been offering feedback to Thinking About Health columns. But never has a column inspired more emailed messages than the one I wrote in March about private long-term care insurance and the lack of a national system to pay for nursing home and community

And once again, the emails illustrated the pickle families find them-

Marty Callahan, who edits the Greeley Citizen in Greeley, Neb., told me in his area "costs are escalating at nursing facilities and more and more of my readers are entering facilities at alarming levels as Medicaid residents." That means those families had no money to pay the nursing home tab which in Nebraska now averages \$72,000 annually for a semi-private and \$80,000 for a private room. This topic "is getting far too little attention," Callahan said, adding, "This is, indeed, going



At age 89 she broke her hip. Cooper said, "It was a gradual downhill from there."

Eventually she went to a nursing home, and the family paid the bill from the \$50,000 cashing out the CDs when the bills came due. When that was gone, she went on Medicaid, and the facility moved her from a small private room to a shared room. In the end she had less than \$2,000 in the bank plus her car.

The woman says the real tragedy was that her mom could not understand why she had no money. She would call the banks and ask where her money was. "I told them to make up a reason," she said. "How do you tell someone who sacrificed her whole life for others that she didn't have her money to spend in the end?"

One email from a 63-year-old man in Jacksonville, Ill., described an all-too-typical predicament — premiums for policies he and his wife bought when they were in their late 50's were rising so high they could no longer pay them. Last year they went up 83 percent. He said he had to shorten the annual benefit and the number of years the policy would pay in order to keep it in force, hardly an ideal solution. He says he will probably drop the policy in the next couple of years, another bad solution. The carrier said to expect another rate increase in 2016.

An 81-year-old woman from Rome City, Ind., wanted me to know that the monthly premium for a policy she bought for home care 19 years ago had increased from \$60 to \$124, but she would not drop the policy because she couldn't afford the cost of a new one. "I do have to say that having this policy has given me some peace of mind," she wrote. She wants care at home, and the policy will pay for some of it. But if she needs a nursing home, she may have to go on Medicaid like thousands of other Americans.

I turned to Bonnie Burns, a national long-term care expert who also works with California Health Advocates. These emails are typical, she said. Most people spending down are just short of being considered low-income, and "they exhaust every little bit they have." As for the larger thread running through them, it shows "we leave it up to every single family to figure it out on their own."

Burns has spent the last two decades trying to improve long-term care insurance in California, a state that has been a leader in consumer protection standards such as reforming home care benefits and "three serious attempts to regulate rates." The intent, she explained, "Was to prevent the large rate increases we see today. All three have failed."

Legislation on the table in California would create a task force to consider the feasibility of a statewide long-term care program. It would examine everything from fragmentation of services to payment. California may well lead again, but it might take collective voices from across the country to effect change. Tom, a reader in Ridgeway, Colo., suggested "a lot of us are going to have to make a lot more noise if we're ever going to see any movement toward a more decent, humane, and affordable (end-of-life) strategy for the elderly."
