Armed Forces Day

Brian Gravatt put up the flags on Groton's Main Street Saturday morning for Armed Forces Day. President Harry S. Truman led the effort to establish a single holiday for citizens to come together and thank our military members for their patriotic service in support of our country.

On August 31, 1949, Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced the creation of an Armed Forces Day to replace separate Army, Navy, Marine Corps and Air Force Days.

The single day celebration stemmed from the unification of the Armed Forces under the Department of Defense.

City crew to work on baseball lights

There is \$3,000 budgeted for repair of the baseball lights. The council decided to try and repair as many lights as possible with city equipment and staff. There are 11 bulbs not working. The council will consider bringing in Musco next year to replace all of the bulbs. The quote from Musco was \$7,100 to relamp all of the fixtures and \$3,375 to repair the 11 bulbs. Their cost did not include ballasts, capacitors, fuses and additional lamps. If necessary, the city will try and get the East River boom truck in to reach the top of the light towers to do further repairs.

The Safe Route to School sidewalk is planned for the north side of Fifth Avenue will run from First Street west to Lincoln Street. The project will become part of the 2016 SD37 project. Clark Engineering had extra engineering fees associated with the project and requested an increase for \$592.80. The council had to agree to it so that they get paid from the Department of Transportation grant. Since there will be a new street on Fifth Avenue West, Councilman Burt Glover asked if the contractor will take responsibility if they do any damage to the new road. City Finance Officer Anita Lowary said that Clark Engineering saved the city a lot of money by not having to moving a bunch of infrastructure with the project.

Jennifer Sietsema from the Northeast Council of Government came before the council to talk about the Hazard Mitigation Survey. Grant funding is available and the city has to adopt the Brown County plan. Mitigation is any action that will prevent damage in the future. She said that the city needs to come up with projects and prioritize the projects. A couple of projects presented is a generator for the storm shelter at the school, burying the power lines and replacement of the water tower. It was also mentioned that the city needs a new steamer to open up storm sewer vents that are frozen up.

Sietsema said it could be a possibility and will ask the state if that would be an option.

Kami Lipp, Brenda Madsen and Karla Pasteur were present to talk about the pool regulations in regards to the new slide. Some of the rules are:

Must be 48 inches tall and pass the swim test.

Only approved swim suits allowed

One rider on the slide at a time

One person on each landing at a time

Slide feet first, on your back or in sitting position.

The pool side refinishing project amounted to about \$8,000 for sandblasting and powder coating. The 110' slide has been installed at the Groton Swimming Pool. The pool is scheduled to open June 1.

A request to close the alley between Main Street and Third Street between Third Avenue and Fourth Avenue June 13 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. for an auction was granted.

A plat for Hanlon west of the rubble site road, south of Railroad Avenue (the old gas station property) was approved.

One person had requested a refund of a partial rubble site permit. They had unexpected surgery and will not be using it for the rest of the year. They would be willing to pay for the \$10 one time fee. The council ruled that permits are not refundable.

Jay Peterson stopped at city hall at Ipswich about the flashing radar units installed in Ipswich. "You can get a lot of data out of them," he said. "With the data, you can figure out when to patrol and when not to patrol. That flashing light really gets your attention." Their cost was \$6,000 for two units.

Shawn Lambertz was hired as electric superintendent at a rate of \$35 an hour.



I was so tired and I just wanted to go home and get some sleep but instead we headed down the road and entered the church located in the neighboring town. We chose to sit on the outside end of a pew located near the back of the church. Not long after we were situated a blonde woman walked in and sat down. She positioned herself in the pew in front of us but chose to sit a bit closer to the inside aisle. Not long after she was seated, the services began and everything seemed to be rolling along quite well. About three fourths into the Mass, before Communion, there was time set aside for silent prayer and it was then, when I finished

my prayers and opened my eyes I caught site of the woman ahead of us. I saw her lean over just a bit to the right and all of a sudden I heard one of the healthiest doses of flatulence you could ever imagine!!!! This was the day I knew God definitely had a sense of humor and without His amazing grace, I would have ceased to exist.

I had limited options at this point. I would never choose to disrespect anyone, especially at church, but I do believe this day helped me to realize, prayers do get answered. Some are answered in time, some are answered in ways we never imagined and some are answered within seconds of being heard!


