Groton Sales Tax Collections up 2% from last year

The Groton City sales tax collections for Jan-Nov 2016 are \$454,425.13 for the 2% general sales tax. This is \$7,356.13 (2%) above the 2015 collections to this point.

Lots of perfect attendance at elementary school

Groton Ford and S & S Lumber teamed together to offer to buy a bicycle for all students who have missed 4 or less periods. Elementary Principal Brett Schwan reported that so far, there are 104 students who would qualify for a bicycle. Of course, it's only nearing midterm, but Schwan said that number is higher than normal.

Merle Harder questioned why tires were purchased out of town when tires are available in town. "I know they might have saved a little money, but we should buy in town," Harder said.

There were updates on the elementary construction project and the middle/high school proposed project.

Some of the concerns for the middle/high school project were discussed. The most favorable was to keep the 1957 and 1979 additions and to remove the 1934 addition. A plan will also be put into place for the placement of the school class pictures that are currently hanging in the 1934 addition. Roger Rix was at the meeting he asked about space for band and vocal practices which has not been addressed. There will be more discussion on the middle/high school project. Make sure you watch the first part of the school board story at GDILIVE.COM where detailed reports were made on both projects.

Superintendent Joe Schwan reported on the Average Daily Membership. The combined 9-11 ADM was 117.143 which would qualify Groton Area for Class B golf; however, the request will be made to keep Groton Class A as Class A golf is in the fall and Class B golf is in the spring. In addition, the ADM male count is 51 with the cutoff off at 56 for Class 9AA football. The administration recommended that Groton Area remain Class 11B because in the next cycle, the enrollment would push Groton Area back to Class 11B. Board member Deb Gengerke questioned the safety of the players. There will be more discussion on this at the next school board meeting.

The Associated School Board Protective Trust, which is where the school district gets health insurance for its faculty members, has undercharged its premiums for 20 years. As a result, the trust has incurred a large debt. The trust reorganized its debt and assessed it back to the school districts based on the number of health care plans at the end of FY2015. Groton's share of this debt is \$307,000. The board decided to pay for this debt over four years at an interest rate of 1.5 percent.

There was a request for the district to sponsor a Trapshooting Club. Bowdle, Miller and Platte-Geddes are currently participating.

The boilers in the Arena have been fixed. The burners were worn out. A new burner was installed in one of the boiler and the parts from the two boilers were put together to fix the second boiler. The repair cost was \$7,500. The replace both boilers would have been \$40,000.

Becca Tullar from the Brown County 4-H extension office came to Groton for four days last week. She had a presentation on robotics to the fifth graders.

Mary Locken from the Dacotah Prairie Museum will come to the elementary school once a month to offer a class to the junior kindergarten students.

Groton Area's oral interp team earned a team excellence award at the state level. Middle/High School Principal Dr. Anna Schwan reported that Groton's Oral Interp team has done very well this year. Groton picked up three superior ratings at state and Schwan said, "They don't hand out very many superior ratings at state." Keri Pappas got a composite superior in non original oratory and Thane Henschel received a composite superior in poetry. Erin Smith and Jenifer Fjelstad received a duo superior and two excellent ratings.

Dr. Schwan reported that the Parent Advisory Council meal was held December 9 and they sold out. Much of the proceeds will go to the junior class prom. The after-prom will be "Glow Bowling" at the bowling alley in Aberdeen.

Dr. Anna Schwan has been chosen as the Region 4 Principal of the Year once again. She will be making a presentation on motivation at the annual principal's conference in April.

Gracious Death

He was my neighbor, not my patient; a guy my age, a man of many talents and interests, and a dear friend. He was one of those fellows who would give the shirt off his back to help you, if needed. When he was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer which had spread to the liver, he, his daughters, and his friends knew how this was likely going to go. But we didn't realize how graciously he would handle the dying process until the very end.

My friend was treated with and was truly helped by chemotherapy for a while, but gradually the tumor cells developed resistance to the drugs and the Oncologist suggested no more chemo. My friend was ready to have only pain meds and hospice care. In the end, per his direction and with the help of hospice and the caring people at the Arlington Nursing Home, he shuffled off this mortal coil comfortably, surrounded by his family and friends.

Fortunately, he had a compassionate and grounded primary care doctor and oncologist team who were realistic about his condition and knew when to stop intervention. He also had loving daughters and friends to surround him with support, plenty of ready-to-heat-and-eat tater-tot-like hot-dishes, an advanced directive that said he was not to have any pointless medical intervention, and plenty of pain medicine for

comfort. When I visited him two days before his death he told me, despite an expanding belly full of cancer, that he was without pain. Most importantly, he was absolutely unafraid; courageously accepting of the dying process.

In comparison, I find it tragic and too common that patients and families are overwhelmed with a fear of death. Some suggest this disabling-dread comes from our cultural practice of protecting children from seeing death, with the intention of making life easier on them. Thus, a lifelong apprehension and running from death has become the norm. Consequently, we expect modern medicine to save us in the end, which can be a desperate, futile, and harmful hope, especially in an end-of-life situation. What's more, physicians struggle taking the time and challenge of helping people in denial face their dying process. Bottom line, too many people choose to be dragged through unnecessary suffering at their end of life, and too often doctors comply.

Rather, dying people should ask for and be reassured that enough comfort medicine will be provided and that it's going to be alright. Our profession has been improving in this regard, but certainly could do better.

When it's time, we should all have the opportunity for a gracious death, just like my neighbor.

Weekly Vikings Roundup By Jordan Wright

The Minnesota Vikings defeated the Jacksonville Jaguars on Sunday, 25-16. Interestingly, there have been only three games in the entire history of the NFL that ended in a 25-16 score, and the Vikings have been a part of two of them this season (week 1 versus Tennessee). The Vikings are now 7-6 on the season and two full games behind Detroit for the NFC North lead.

Minnesota's offense showed signs of life on Sunday, moving the ball against a decent Jacksonville defense at will. The biggest surprise was the offensive line, who didn't allow a sack and only gave up two quarterback hits. With a clean pocket, Sam Bradford was able to hold the ball a little longer and find receivers downfield, completing five passes of 20 yards or more. Bradford finished the day completing 24 of 34 passes (71%) for 292 yards and a touchdown.

The offense picked up big chunks of yards, but were unable to do much of anything where it counted, in the red zone. The Vikings reached the red zone five times on Sunday, but only came away with points on two of those trips. As we have seen all season, the team is unable to pick up a yard or two when they really need it. In the second quarter, the Vikings had first and goal at the Jaguars' three-yard line and ended up turning the ball over on downs. Later, in the fourth quarter with the Vikings only leading by two points, the offense had first and goal at the Jaguars' one-yard line. Matt Asiata ended up losing the ball on third down, and once again the Vikings came away with zero points when all they needed was 12 inches.

The Vikings defense played a great game, even without their leader Harrison Smith (ankle). It all started with the defensive line, who accumulated all of Minnesota's sacks (4) and quarterback hits (7). On the back end, Xavier Rhodes had an up and down day. Rhodes was consistently lined up against Marqise Lee, Jacksonville's best wide receiver, who finished with five catches for 113 yards.

This week the player of the game is Everson Griffen, who was a one-man wrecking crew on Sunday. Griffen had two sacks, three quarterback hits, two tackles for a loss, and a pass deflection against the Jaguars, leading the Vikings in all four categories. Everson Griffen was the highest rated player in purple and gold per Pro Football Focus, earning an 84.1 player grade. Newly signed kicker Kai Forbath deserves some recognition as well after making all four of his field goal attempts.

The player who needs the most improvement this week is once again Anthony Barr. As I mentioned previously, Anthony Barr has done a complete turn-around from last season. Barr was ranked as the second-best linebacker in 2015, and is one of the worst linebackers in the NFL this season. There were multiple plays on Sunday where Barr was either out of position or unable to make the play, which resulted in sustained drives by the Jaguars. According to PFF, he was on the field for 66 plays in week 14, yet was only able to amass four tackles. Anthony Barr used to be a difference-maker on defense, but is becoming a liability.

Looking ahead, the Vikings will welcome Andrew Luck and the 6-7 Indianapolis Colts to Minnesota next Sunday, December 18. Andrew Luck is a phenomenal young quarterback, but is surrounded by mediocre players. Great quarterbacks can always make a game competitive, so this game will not be an easy one to win. However, if the Vikings' defense can continue to get pressure on opposing quarterbacks and the offensive line can keep Sam Bradford upright, the Vikings will have a good chance to win their second in a row. After Indianapolis, the Vikings will travel to Green Bay before finishing the season at home against Chicago. The Vikings are still in the playoff hunt, but can't afford to play at anything less than 100 percent.



The national average has increased for 14 days in a row following the OPEC oil production agreement on November 30. Today's average of \$2.21 per gallon is up three cents per gallon on the week and two cents per gallon on the month. The national average is up 20 cents compared to the same date last year.




