



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

Larson takes sixth in 200m dash, ties personal best record



2015 Groton High School graduate, Landon Larson, recently competed in his second Summit League Conference, Indoor Championship Track Meet. He was one of four SDSU Jackrabbit sprinters, on the men's team, to compete. competed in two events, the 200 meter dash and the 4x400 meter relay.

In the 200 meter dash, Larson finished 8th in the prelims, which got him into

the finals, where he finished 6th. He ran against a nationally diverse group of men in the finals, schools represented are South Dakota State University-SDSU, University of South Dakota-USD, and Oral Roberts-OR.

Landon tied his personal best in the 200 meter dash indoor, with a time of 21.83, which leaves him .01 of a second from the SDSU school record, and second on the school's top ten of all-time list.

NDSU ended up winning the meet on the men's side. The difference between 2nd and 3rd came down to the final event, the 4x400 relay, which Larson also participated in. The SDSU team took 3rd in the relay, Oral Roberts finished first and NDSU second, which put the SDSU mens team .5 points over USD to earn them 2nd place overall at the tournament.

Weekly Vikings Roundup By Jordan Wright

After winning the first week of free agency,

the Minnesota Vikings have turned their attention to the second tier of free agents, as well as possibly re-signing their own players.

If you read last week's column, you know the Vikings had three goals entering the offseason: finding



a new offensive coordinator, finding their starting quarterback, and upgrading the defensive tackle position. Knowing this team has a window to win a championship, the front office didn't hold back - electing to sign the best people available to fill their needs. After signing John DeFilippo to be the offensive coordinator, Kirk Cousins to be the quarterback, and Sheldon Richardson to be the defensive tackle next to Linval Joseph, the team has switched gears and will now attempt to sign players for depth while also looking at several young players – Stefon Diggs, Anthony Barr, Danielle Hunter, Eric Kendricks, and Trae Waynes – who are eligible for contract extensions.

line, the Vikings have signed Tom Compton, a player who can play both quard and tackle if needed. Compton is from the Rosemont, MN area, and he followed the Vikings growing up. He also has a close friendship with Kirk Cousins, as they were both drafted by the Redskins in 2012. Compton was in Washington through the 2015 season, before going to Atlanta for the 2016 season. He was most recently in Chicago. Compton has started 16 games at both guard spots and right tackle during his career.

The Vikings also re-signed kick Kai Forbath. Forbath was signed by the Vikings halfway through the 2016 season, where he went a perfect 15 for 15 on field goals. In 2017, he was 32 of 38 on field goal attempts (84%, 18th best percentage in the NFL). One area Forbath will need to improve is kicking the extra point. He was 11 of 14 on extra points in 2016 (78.6%) and 34 of 39 in 2017 (87.2%, 2nd worst percentage in the NFL).

Free agency is the ultimate example of how the NFL is a business. While it's fun for fans to see the team sign big name free agents, it's also unfortunate that the team has to let some players leave. The Vikings have lost a few free agents this offseason, and fans are rightfully sad about a couple of them. The biggest loss for me was Teddy Bridgewater, a player I thought was going to be the Vikings' quarterback for the next 15 years. Instead, he was allowed to walk this offseason, and he signed a one-year contract with the New York Jets. The wide for only \$150. Vikings also lost two other quarterbacks – Sam Bradford to the Arizona Cardinals, and Case Keenum to the Denver Broncos. The Vikings also lost a couple defensive players. Defensive tackles Tom Johnson and Shamar Stephen both signed in Seattle – who needed to replenish the defensive line after losing Sheldon Richardson to the Vikings. The team also lost linebacker Emmanuel Lamur, who signed with the Oakland Raiders and cornerback Tramaine Brock who signed with the Denver Broncos, although neither will be missed much.

The Vikings have a few free agents left who haven't signed anywhere yet, like cornerbacks Terence Newman and Marcus Sherels. I'm sure the Vikings will sign Newman if he wants to continue to play, and if he doesn't come back to Minnesota he will likely retire. Sherels will

likely be back in purple and gold next season, as he is one of the best kick return specialists in the NFL. The remaining two free agents who played in Minnesota last season, wide receiver Michael Floyd and running back Bishop Sankey, are unlikely to be brought back. According to Sportrac, the Vikings have around \$22 million cap space still available. Skol!

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

Brown County Title 6 **Traffic Regulations**

ORDINANCE #115 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE 6 TRAFFIC REGULATIONS SECOND REVISION BROWN COUNTY ORDINANCES, AS

AMENDED BE IT ORDAINED by the Brown County Commission, Brown County, South Dakota that Second Revision Brown County Ordinances, shall be amended

as follows: TITLE 6 TRAFFIC REGULA-**TIONS**

Chapter 6.05 - Prohibiting the Lawful Use of Engine and Compression Release Brakes

Section 6.0501. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to prohibit the excess, loud, unusual or explosive use of engine and compressed air braking devices within the designated areas of Brown County.

Section 6.0502. Definitions. For the purpose of this ordinance the following words and phrases are defined as follows: Engine retarding brake means a Compression Release Brake, transmission brake or any other engine retarding brake systems that alters the normal compression of the engine and subsequently releases that compression and creates an excessively loud noise.

Section 6.0503. Prohibitions. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to use or operate or cause to be used or operated within designated areas in the County of Brown, State of South Dakota, any engine brake, Compression Brake or mechanical exhaust device designed to aid in the braking or deceleration of any vehicle that results in excess, loud, unusual or explosive noise from such vehicle, unless such use is necessary to avoid imminent danger. Such prohibition shall be applicable only to those streets, roads, alleys easements, or rights of way established for vehicle operation within Brown County.

Section 6.0504. Areas of Prohibition. The prohibition set forth herein shall apply to any public roads or highways in Brown County which are designated by signage as approved by the Brown County Commissioners.

Section 6.0505. Exceptions. Emergency vehicles shall be exempt from application of this ordinance.

Section 6.0506. Penalties. Any driver and/or firm or corporation for whom the driver is employed who shall violate this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, be summoned to pay a fine of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) along with any court costs.

Harder, Reder resign their positions

Two resignations were accepted and there may be changes in the school's health insurance options. The Groton Area Board of Education met Monday evening in the Commons room of the Groton Area Elementary School. The board accepted the resignations of Cory Harder as girls soccer coach and Dodie Reder as a custodian. Harder has taken on a trucking job so he will not be in the area any more. Reder resigned because of health related issues.

Business Manager Mike Weber talked about the health insurance that the school employees have and he foresees the \$500 and the \$750 deductible options to be eliminated by the company. The board may look at adding two more higher deductibles to the school's offering.

Program reviews of the fourth and fifth grade were presented. Guthmiller and Fieldheim talked about the fourth graders and Lone and Hendrickson talked about the fifth graders. There are 50 students in the fourth grade and 45 in the fifth grade. The fifth grade is getting a new reading series which will help meet the common core requirements. Ipads have been very useful for the fourth graders.

A 1999 Ford Windstar Van was declared as surplus. Open enrollment for students already attending school in Groton were approved for a freshman, an eighth grader, and sixth grader and a kindergarten student from the Northwestern Area School District. The Title 1 program was annroved to an schoolwide. The board approved for membership into the South Dakota High School Activities Association for the 2018-19 school year. Whitney Berner was hired as the new high school math teacher. Berner is currently a student teacher under Darlyne Johnson. After Tara Arntsen has her baby, Berner will take over her math class.

Middle/High School Principal Kiersten Sombke talked about the proposed graduation requirements that may take effect the 2020-21 school year. One of the option's is to give students more flexibility in fulfilling graduation requirements. It has been since 2009 that the last changes were made to graduation requirements.
