School district to start returning to normal June 1 The Groton Area School Board met in personal session Monday in

the GHS Conference room. They were adequately spaced apart and took up the whole room in a U-shaped set-up.

One of the big items talked about was the budget, which may not be really decided until September. Business Manager Mike Weber said the state will not release what the per student rate will be until that time. It is usually done in June. Weber said one of the big items that could affect the budget is the ethanol plants. He said he was concerned about the valuation of the plants and how much it could affect the district's budget.

Weber estimated that the district could have a short fall of \$79,362 with a 2 percent increase in the per student rate to \$135,243 with no increase. There is also a chance the state may go with a negative 2 percent. The district will be saving some money this year with school not being in session and the district could receive up to \$65,000 in the CARES relief act, if the district can spend that much related to COVID-19.

The district is preparing to start returning to normal operations on June 1, which includes summer athletics programming with new rules being put in place.

There was some concern about graduation being held July 12, with it possibly being hot in the arena. Superintendent Joe Schwan said they had a zoom meeting with the seniors, of which 13 attended, and they decided that they wanted graduation to be as normal as possible and would be willing to put up with the heat for a short period of time. There was discussion about having graduation at the football field, but that would do away with the slide show, so that was ruled out.

The start of the football season could be interesting if the football helmets are not returned on time. They were sent in for reconditioning in January, as required annually. The plant has been shut down for some time due to COVID-19 and will not reopen unil June 1. The Riddell company is "hoping" to have the helmets shipped out to colleges and high schools by August 15th.

Both principals gave a might thank you to the both Parent Advisory Committeess. All staff members received a thank you gift for their hard work during this panademic.

Bill Duncan's resignation was accepted after his 30 years of service to the Groton Area School Distirct. Kayla Duncan was hired as a full time vocal music teacher for the 2020-21 school year. Kayla Duncan's vote was approved, 4-3, with Tigh Fliehs, Deb Gengerke and Kara Pharis voting no.

One open enrollment was approved and one was denied after an executive session.

About Your Absentee Voting Ballot Request A new rule in place this year affects your absentee ballot request.

According to Groton Area School Business Manager Mike Weber, he reported to the board of education Monday night that the request is now good for the rest of the year. In other words, if you requested an absentee ballot for the June primary, you will also, automatically, receive in the mail a ballot for the general election in November.

Also on the request form is a space requesting a ballot for just the primary or municipal or school or for all of them. If you checked the all box, you will automatically receive a ballot for any upcoming election for 2020 that you are eligible to vote.

Weber reported that so far, he has received 250 absentee ballots for school board and is averaging a dozen ballots each day. In the last school board election, there was a total of 335 votes cast. Weber reported that he had run out of envelopes and had to order more which he received on Monday.

For the June 2 primary, there will be a county ballot, a Groton Area School Board ballot and a Ward 2 Groton City ballot.

In South Dakota, the County Election Official must receive your application for absentee ballot no later than 5 p.m. the day before the election. Your voted ballot MUST be received by your County Election Official on Election Day in enough time to deliver your ballot to your voting precinct before the polls close.

American Legion Baseball 2020 season cancelled What happens to the state tournament scheduled for Groton?

The American Legion national leadership has canceled all American Legion Baseball for the 2020 season. Initially, all regional tournaments and the American Legion World Series had been canceled, but the decision to have a local program was left up to individual states. Twenty-five states had decided to cancel their programs; the other 25 had either chose to play the season or had not yet decided.

On Saturday, May 9th, after lengthy discussion, the South Dakota American Legion Athletic Commission recommended playing the 2020 season as long as local, state, and national guidance concerning COVID 19 was followed. The South Dakota American Legion Executive Committee approved their recommendation. However, based on continued concerns regarding COVID 19, The American Legion National Organization has shut down all sponsorship and all involvement in baseball for the 2020 season. The primary concern being the protection of the players, coaches, baseball officials, and the spectators across the country. This shutdown of all sponsorship means that those baseball teams that wish to continue playing 2020 season baseball shall be participating in a sporting event not sponsored, nor endorsed in any manner, by The American Legion National Organization. Those teams that decide to conduct a 2020 baseball season program will need to determine their rules, guidelines, schedules, insurance coverage, etc., for their programs as The American Legion National Organization will not provide this assistance. Since receiving the national organization's guidance, the South Dakota American Legion Executive Committee has rescinded its approval for the 2020 season.

Meanwhile Groton was suppose to host the State B American Legion Baseball Tournament this year. According to Kevin Kempel, Dept. Adjutant for the South Dakota American Legion, "It's not an easy question because next year's venues have already been identified, so the discussion becomes to push everything back a year, or have the folks schedule next year hold next year and then those schedule this year the year after. Lots of balls to balance, so it may take some investigating by the Commission before there is an answer."





RESOLUTION NO. 20-05-05R RESOLUTION EXTENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2020-01 COVID-19 EMERGENCY ORDI-

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO ADDRESS A PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS BY IMPLEMENTING CER-TAIN MEASURES WHICH HAVE BEEN DEEMED NECESSARY TO SLOW THE COMMUNITY SPREAD OF CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

WHEREAS, the guidance issued by the White House further recommended that in states with evidence of community transmission, bars, restaurants, food courts, gyms and other indoor and outdoor venues where people congregate should be closed; and

WHEREAS, the city of Columbia has the authority pursuant to SDCL 9-29-1 and SDCL 9-32-1 to pass ordinances for the purpose of promoting the health, safety, morals, and general welfare, of the community, and to what may be necessary for the promotion of health or the suppression of

diseases; and WHEREAS, an outbreak of the disease COVID-19, which is caused by the novel coronavirus, has been confirmed in more than 100 countries, including the

United States: and WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a severe respiratory disease transmitted by person-to-person contact, or by contact with surfaces contaminated by the virus. In some cases, especially among older adults and persons with serious underlying health conditions, COVID-19 can result in serious illness requiring hospitalization, admission to an intensive

care unit, and death; and WHERAS, the World Health Organization (WHO), the Centers

for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services have declared the outbreak of COVID-19 as a public health emergency; and

WHERAS, many states and communities across the country have already implemented the White House recommendations by ordering all bars, restaurants, food courts, gyms, and other indoor and outdoor venues where people congregate be closed until the pubic health emergency is over; and

WHÉRAS, the failure to successfully implement social distancing will likely result in higher numbers of infected individual and has the potential to overwhelm the capacity of the County's health care providers; and

WHERAS, it is important that control measures be taken to reduce or slow down the spread of COVID-19 in order to protect the health and safety of the City's residents, especially seniors and those with underlying health conditions and make the particularly vulnerable to CO-VID-19; and

WHÉRAS, on March 13,2020, President Donald Trump declared a national emergency in response to the global pandemic of COVID-19; and

WHERAS, the Governor of the State of South Dakota entered an Executive Order (2020-04) declaring a state of emergency currently exists within the state of South Dakota, and further the Governor of the State of South Dakota entered an Executive Order (2020-08) providing direction and guidance for South Dakota citizens, businesses,

and governing bodies of South Dakota in which all local and municipal government located in the State of South Dakota take specific steps contained within said Executive Order; and

WHEREAS, it is important that control measures be taken to reduce or slow down the spread of COVID-19 in order to protect the health and safety of the City's residents, especially for seniors and those with underlying health conditions that make them par-

ticularly vulnerable to COVID-19. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RE-SOLVED by the city of Columbia, South Dakota:

1. The City Council affirms that some, but not all, of the social distancing measures set forth in Paragraphs 1, 2 of the emergency ordinance are necessary for the prevention and spread within the City of Abereen of the contagious virus.

2. The City Council hereby extends paragraphs 1, 2 of the emergency ordinance for the day following the next regular or special meeting of the City Council, except that part of each paragraph that prohibits or closes on-site consumption, sales, or services if such business, facility, club, shop, organization, or other entity complies with the following restrictions:

1. Effective at 12:00 a.m. on May 5, 2020, all restaurants, food courts, food service locations, coffee houses, bars, breweries, distillers, wineries, clubs, cafes, motel lobbies offering food service, and other similar places of public accommodation offering food and beverages for onsite consumption, including and alcohol licensees with on-sale privileges, . These businesses may continue to operate in order to provide take-out, delivery,

curbside service, and dine in service and a maximum of 20 individuals in the establishment at any given time. Any business continuing to operate in order to provide off-site service should implement procedures to ensure social distancing and operate in compliance with federal and state health guidance in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. This restriction will remain in effect through the next city meeting which is held on the first Tuesday of every month.

2. Effective at 12:00 a.m. on May 5, 2020, all churches, community centers, legion halls are directed to limit their operations to no more than 20 individuals in the establishment at one time. This restriction will remain in effect through the next city meeting which is held on the first Tuesday of every month.

3. The prohibitions and closures in the order do not apply to the following businesses:

a. Any emergency facility necessary for the response to the current public health emergency or any other community

emergency or disaster.
b. Official meetings of the city, schools, county, or state, as may me set in said entities.

4. This ordinance shall remain in effect for a period of thirty (30) days, at which time it shall be revisited at every city council meeting, which are held on the first Tuesday of every month. Any dates identified in the ordinance for closures to automatically end may be adjusted at anytime within the thirty (30) day period covered by this ordinance by resolution of the City Council. This ordinance can be amended or canceled with an emergency Columbia City Council meeting at any given time.

5. Any violation of this ordinance is subject to a \$500 fine from the City of Columbia, South Dakota. Each day a violation of this ordinance is allowed to occur is considered a separate offense committed by the person(s) in

charge of the facility in violation. BE IN FURTHER ORDAINED, that, pursuant to SDCL 9-19-13. this resolution is necessary due to health emergency and the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Columbia

and shall become effective immediately upon passage.
