

## **Groton Area boys bring home 7th place**

end and finished with a 50-36 win. In the second half, Groton Area made nine of 20 two-pointers, one of eight threepointers, did not attempt any free throws, had 10 rebounds and six turnovers. Flandreau made eight of 18 two-pointers, one of three three-pointers, six of eight free throws, had 13 rebounds and six turnovers.

Jacob Zak led the Tigers with 12 points while Jayden Zak had eight, Kaden Kurtz and Tate Larson each had six and Wyatt Hearnen had four points.

Tash Sunday led the Fliers with 23 points while Chase LeBrun had 12, Liam Street

eight, Alex Anderson three and Paul Parsley and Luke Sheppard each had two points. Coach Brian Dolan said after the game, "Obviously disappointed in how today ended up. Their size was just a little too much for us to overcome, but I thought our kids played their hearts out and we had tremendous effort. Flandreau did a nice job making it hard for us to get going on the offensive end, but we also missed a few really good opportunities at crucial times of the game. Flandreau has a good basketball team and we wish the best of luck tomorrow vs Dakota Valley, now it's time for us to get ready play Sioux Falls Christian and give the same effort we have been giving all year again tomorrow."

Dakota Valley edged out Sioux Falls Christian in the first game, 62-56 in a game that had 10 lead changes and was tied five times. In the evening bracket, Sioux Valley defeated Winner, 58-54, and St. Thomas More defeated Lakota Tech, 63-53. Flandreau put two players in double figures as the Fliers pulled away with a 50-36 win in the first round of the State A Basketball Tournament. The tournament is being played at Summit Arena at The Monument in Rapid City. While this is the first time in 21 years that Groton Area is at the state tournament, this is the first state tournament for Coach Brian Dolan. But Dolan said, "It's all about the kids."

Flandreau took a 6-0 lead before Jayden Zak hit a three-pointer to get the Tigers on the scoreboard. Tate Larson and Kaden Kurtz had back-to back baskets as Groton Area tied the game at six. The game was tied at eight before the Fliers took a 13-8 lea. It was 15-10, Flandreau, after the first quarter.

The Fliers kept the upper hand in the second quarter and upped its advantage to 10 at half time, 27-17.

In the first half, Groton Area made five of 14 two-pointers, two of five three-pointers, made five of eight free throws, had eight rebounds and eight turnovers. Flandreau made 13 of 23 two-pointers, missed two three-pointers, made one of two free throws, had 11 rebounds and five turnovers.







#### Sioux Falls Christian uses height advantage to get past Groton Area

Sioux Falls Christian used its height and it took its toll in the second half as the Chargers defeated Groton Area, 86-56, in the consolation semifinal game. The State A Tournament is being played at Summit Arena at the Monument in Rapid City.

The Chargers jumped out to a 4-0 lead and it was late in the first quarter before the Tigers were able to tie the game at 15 and the Tigers took a 17-15 lead. The game was tied at 17 and Jayden Zak made a three-pointer as the Tigers took a 20-17 lead at the break. Kaden Kurtz made a three-pointer and Groton Area took a 23-17 lead. The Chargers battled back to tie the game 23 and the game was tied at 25, 27 and 29.

Groton Area used three time-outs in the second quarter and Coach Brian Dolan said, "Every timeout called was necessary to keep us focused on the task at hand."

The lead changed hands four times before the Chargers took a 37-35 lead at half time.

In the first half, Groton out-rebounded Sioux Falls Christian, 14-13, the Chargers made four of 12 threepointers while the Tigers missed four three-pointers. Groton Area made 16 of 29 field goals compared to 14 of 27 for the Chargers. Groton Area made five of six in free throws and Sioux Falls Christian made three of seven.

The game was tied three more times in the third quarter before the tide changed. "The officials started letting kids be more physical," Dolan said, " (off the ground) and it obviously favored the team with more size. Our kids came out and played just hard and executed in the third, things changed late in the third."

The Chargers started to pull away with the help of controlling the boards. Sioux Falls Christian outrebounded Groton Area in the second half, 23-7. The Chargers took a 63-50 lead at the end of the third quarter.

There was no more catching up for the Tigers. Every time the Tigers scored, the Chargers would answer. "I don't think they were quicker or that we were sluggish," Dolan said. "We were out of position at times. And we're late getting back on defense."

The reserves for both teams got to play in the final minute of the game as the Chargers went on











#### Groton Area claims 7th at the State A Tournament

Groton Area brought home the seventh place trophy at the State A Basketball Tournament held this past weekend at the Summit Arena at the Monument, Rapid City. The Tigers defeated Lakota Tech, 66-57, in the seventh place game.

It was the final game for the three seniors and Coach Brian Dolan started all three - Wyatt Hearnen, Kaden Kurtz and Jayden

The first quarter was a little shaky for the Tigers, plagued with four turnovers and missed shots, the Tatanka jumped out to an 8-0 lead and held a 15-8 lead after the first quarter.

After Lakota Tech scored the opening basket in the second quarter, the Tigers scored eight straight points to take the lead for the first time, 18-17. The Tatanka tied the game at 18 and 20 before taking a 22-20 lead. The Tigers tied the game at 22 and rolled on with a pair of free throws by Jayden Zak and a three-pointer by Lane Tietz as the Tigers took a 27-22. Groton Area led at half time, 27-24.

Groton Area made 8 of 25 field goals in the first half for 32 percent, 3 of 11 in three-pointers for 27 percent, and made 8 of 9 free throws for 89 percent. Lakota Tech made 10 of 23 field goals for 43 percent, 1 of 5 three-pointers for 20 percent, and made 3 of 8 free throws for 38 percent. Groton Area had the edge in rebounds, 17-15, and the Tatanka had more turnovers, 8-7.

Dolan went deeper into the bench than he had the first two games. He said, "It was the third game in three days and it was our plan going deeper so we could have our starters fresh for the second half. Cole Simon, Teylor Diegel and Logan Ringgenberg did a great job giving us minutes to get some of the guys some well deserved rest."

The Tatanka recaptured the lead in the third quarter, 30-29, but then the Tigers went on a 12-point run to take a 41-30 lead. Tietz scored nine points in the third quarter to help springboard the Tigers to the 11-point lead. Groton Area led, 41-35 after the

In the fourth quarter, there was a double foul situation and Dolan explained what happened: "We got called for a common


