# Groton Area earns Spirit of Six Award The Spirit of Six honors six Rapid City High School cheerleaders who died in a plane crash

on March 17, 1968, at Rapid City Regional Airport as they returned from leading Cobbler fans at the state championships in Sioux Falls. Jan Glaze, Shirley Landstrom, Laureen "Kay" Mc-Nutt, Terry Blanton, Diana McCluskey, and Gail Flohr died, along with pilot Ivan Landstrom, his wife, Mary (Shirley's parents), and English teacher and cheer adviser Dorothy Lloyd. The South Dakota Peace Officers originated the award to memorialize the girls by recognizing an outstanding cheerleading squad that exemplifies the late leaders' commitment and dynamism.



4. Character: Able to interact in a positive fashion with students and adults, displaying self-discipline, high ethics, and respectful behavior. And is also a positive role model for young people.

5. Academic Ability: Maintains a 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale.

## No. 1 Sioux Falls Christian 74 No. 8

**Vermillion 48** Sioux Falls Christian steamed past Vermillion 74-48 in impressive fashion in the quarterfinal round. The Chargers 50% from the field and were led by Griffen Goodbary, who finished with 20-points and four blocks. Brant Wassenaar also contributed 14-points and nine rebounds. Vermillion was led by Bryson Skogsberg, who put up 15-points in the game.

#### No. 5 Dakota Valley 62 No. 4 Pine Ridge 58

Dakota Valley survived a late game rally to defeat Pine Ridge 62-58 in the quarterfinals. The Panthers shot 42% from the field, but it was their rebounding and second chance points that was the difference down the stretch. Dakota Valley finished +12 in the rebounding differential. Luke Bruns and Jaxson Wingert both finished with 24-points for the Panthers. Pine Ridge was led by Marvin Richard III, who dropped 30-points in the contest.

**No. 2 Hamlin 46 No. 7 Groton Area 45** Hamlin survived a last second attempt to defeat Groton Area 46-45 in the quarterfinals. This matchup was incredibly even. Groton Area shot 43% from the field, while Hamlin shot 42%. Both teams tied with 13 turnovers and tied in the rebounding category too. Easton Neuendorf scored 17-points for the Chargers, and he recorded five assists too. Tyson Stevenson also scored 10-points for Hamlin. Groton's top scorer was Lane Tietz, who finished with 12. Ryder Johnson also scored 10-points for the Tigers in the loss.

#### No. 6 Rapid City Christian 75 No. 3 Sioux Valley 72 (2 OT)

Rapid City Christian upset third seeded Sioux Valley 75-72 in thrilling double overtime fashion on Thursday night from Rapid City. The Cossacks shot 45% in the game, which was better than the Comets, who shot 35%, but Rapid City Christian scored more points off of turnovers and outrebounded. They also shot more efficiently from the charity stripe. Benson Kieffer scored 25-points and Simon Kieffer knocked down 23-points for the Comets. Max Engebretson was the leading scorer for Sioux Valley with 20-points.

## Free throw gives Hamlin one point win in opening game

Å free throw with 5.5 seconds left in the game lifted Hamlin to a 46-45 win over Groton Area in the first round of the State A Boys Basketball Tournament in Rapid City.

Hamlin started the game with the upper hand, quickly jumping out to an 8-2 lead and led after the first quarter, 11-6. The Chargers powered their way to a 15-point lead at 22-7 early in the second quarter. Coach Brian Dolan said, "We started to find our groove in the second half of the second quarter." The Tigers then started to battle back and by half time, it was 28-20, Hamlin.

Hamlin still kept things on course early in the third quarter with a 10-point lead at 30-20. But then, in less than five minutes, the Tiger defense ripped apart the Chargers and the colorful Groton Area cheering section was on fire. It was 33-26 with Hamlin on top. Logan Ringgenberg found an opening and made a basket. Turnovers were turning into points as Lane Tietz made a basket. Not to be outdone, Ryder Johnson had an assist to score and Keegen Tracy found an easy shot. Tietz sank a three-pointer and the Tigers were on top, 37-33. The third quarter ended, 37-35, Groton Area.

Groton Area opened up a four-point lead early in the fourth quarter at 41-37. Hamlin battled back and tied the game at 43 with 2:35 left and took the lead with 1:37 left, 45-43. Groton Area tied the game at 45, but a foul with 5.5 seconds left put Easton Neuendorf to the free throw line where he made one of two free throws.

Three time-outs were used in the final seconds and the Groton Area attempt to win the game did not materialize.

Lane Tietz led the Tigers with 12 points followed by Ryder Johnson with 10, Jacob Zak eight, Logan Ringgenberg seven and Keegen Tracy and Colby Dunker each had four.

Hamlin was led by Neuendorf with 17 points while Tyson Stevenson had 10, Evan Stormo eight, Zach VanMeeteren six and Jackson Wadsworth five.

Both teams shot 42 percent from the field, both teams had 24 rebounds and both teams had 13 turnovers. Groton Area had one more steal than Hamlin, 7-6. Hamlin had one more assist than Groton Area, 8-7. From the line, Hamlin was 10 of 15 and Groton Area was nine of 13.

#### **Class A Semifinals**

#### No. 1 Sioux Falls Christian 50 No. 5 Dakota Valley 48

Sioux Falls Christian survived a near upset against Dakota Valley on Friday 50-48 to advance to the state title game. At one-point, the Panthers trailed by eleven. Dakota Valley had a look from beyond the arc with twoseconds to play, but the bucket hit back iron, and the Chargers celebration began. Griffen Goodbary had 20-points and nine rebounds for Sioux Falls Christian. Dakota Valley was led by Jaxson Wingert, who scored 20-points and had eight boards in the loss.

#### No. 2 Hamlin 62 No. 6 Rapid City Christian 45

For the first time since 1983, Hamlin will play for a boys state basketball title. The Chargers defeated Rapid City Christian 62-45 in the semifinal round on Friday night. Hamlin shot 45% from the floor. Tyson Stevenson and Easton Neuendorf both led the scoring for the Chargers with 17-points. The Comets were led in scoring by Simon Kieffer, who dropped 17-points in the contest.

#### **Consolation Semifinals**

No. 4 Pine Ridge 79 No. 8 Vermillion 63

Pine Ridge bounced back on Friday with a 79-63 win over Vermillion. As a team, the Thorpes shot 46% from the floor and 40% from beyond the arc. They also were +8 in the rebound category. Jaylin Rouillard finished with 26-points for Pine Ridge, while Marvin Richard III also contributed 19 in the scoring column and grabbed 13-rebounds for the Thorpes. Trey Hansen led Vermillion with 20-points and 11 boards.

#### No. 3 Sioux Valley 67 No. 7 Groton Area 58

Sioux Valley came into Friday coming off a double overtime quarterfinal loss to Rapid City Christian. The Cossacks defeated Groton Area in the consolation semifinals 67-58. Alec Squires finished with 31-points and 12 rebounds to lead Sioux Valley. On the other side, Ryder Johnson scored 19-points and grabbed seven rebounds for the Tigers.

## Johnson has doubledouble in consolation loss to Sioux Valley

Ryder Johnson had a double-double in Groton Area's 67-58 loss to Sioux Valley in the consolation round of the State A Tournament.

**Pakota Valley 48** The game was tied five times at 10, 12, 20 Sioux Falls Christian survived a near upset gainst Dakota Valley on Friday 50-48 to adance to the state title game. At one-point, lead early in the second quarter.

Sioux Valley's Alec Squires used his height to power in nearly half of the Cossack's points. Squires was 10 of 15 in shooting and was 11 of 13 from the line, scoring 31 points and had a double-double with 12 rebounds.

Groton Area came to within one at 51-50 with 4:51 left in the game, and had chances to take the lead. Sioux Valley led at the quarterstops at 14-12, 35-28 and 51-45.

Johnson led the Tigers with 19 points and 10 rebounds while Keegen Tracy had 17 points, Lane Tietz 11, Jacob Zak nine and Colby Dunker two.

Besides Squires, Maxwell Engebretson added 13 points for Sioux Valley with Jace Christensen having eight, Hudson Ruesink and Boden Schiller each had seven points and Brock Christopherson added one point.

In two-pointers, Groton Area was 11 of 24 for 46 percent while Sioux Valley was 20 of 31 for 65 percent. In three-pointers, Groton Area was seven of 26 for 27 percent and Sioux Valley was two of 13 for 15 percent. From the line, Groton Area was 15 of 17 for 88 percent off of Sioux Valley's 18 team fouls. Sioux Valley was 21 of 27 for 78 percent off of Groton Area's 24 team fouls with Ringgenberg and Sippel both fouling out.



Sioux Valley had 17 turnovers with 10 of them being steals, led by Tietz and Johnson with three each. Tietz had four of the team's nine assists. 





#### Championship: No. 2 Hamlin 53 No. 1 Sioux Falls Christian 50 (OT)

For the first time since 1983, Hamlin has won a boys state basketball championship. They defeated Sioux Falls Christian 53-50 on Saturday to clinch the title. Hamlin shot 45% from the field. Tyson Stevenson finished with 16-points for Hamlin, while Easton Neuendorf dropped 12-points. Griffen Goodbary led Sioux Falls Christian with 19-points and ten rebounds.

#### 3rd Place: No. 5 Dakota Valley 78 No. 6 Rapid City Christian 73

Dakota Valley took down Rapid City Christian 78-73 in the 'A' third place game. The Panthers shot 51% in the game, but it was kept close with the Comets winning the turnover and rebounding battle. Dakota Valley was led by Luke Bruns, who finished with 19-points and ten rebounds. Jaxson Wingert also scored 17-points for the Panthers. Rapid City Christian was led by Benson Kieffer, who scored 29-points, and Simon Kieffer who contributed 24-points.

### 5th Place: No. 3 Sioux Valley 69 No. 4 Pine Ridge 51

Sioux Valley defeated Pine Ridge 69-51 in the consolation championship. The Cossacks shot an impressive 60% from the field, which was in big part due to the performance by Alec Squires, who went 9 of 10 for 21-points and grabbed 17-rebounds. Marvin Richard III led the scoring for Pine Ridge with 19-points.

#### 7th Place: No. 7 Groton Area 67 No. 8 Vermillion 49

Groton Area rolled past Vermillion on Saturday afternoon 67-49 in the 'A' seventh place game. Lane Tietz finished with 25-points and six rebounds to lead the way for the Tigers. Jacob Zak also contributed 15-points and grabbed nine rebounds for Groton Area. Vermillion was led by Connor Roerig and Zoan Robinson, who both scored 13-points in the game.

## Groton Area takes seventh with stunning win over Vermillion

Groton Area was never threatened in the seventh place game as the Tigers avenged an earlier loss to Vermillion and posted a 67-49 win at the State A Basketball Tournament.

The Tigers jumped out to a 7-0 lead and Vermillion called two quick time-outs to try and reorganize, but the Tiger defense was too much for Vermillion to handle and the Tigers held a 21-14 lead after the first quarter. Groton Area had a 10-point run to start the second guarter and led at half time, 42-25. The Tanagers scored seven straight points midway in the third quarter, but the Tigers would score the final six points of the quarter to take a 57-34 into the fourth quarter and would go on for the win.

Lane Tietz led the Tigers with 25 points, seven rebounds and four assists. Jacob Zak had 15 points and nine rebounds. Keegen Tracy had 12 points and four assists. Colby Dunker had six points while Kassen Keough had three points and Ryder Johnson, Logan Ringgenberg and Gage Sippel each had two points



From the line, Groton Area was 10 of 12 for 83 percent off of Vermillion's 15 team fouls. Groton Area's 22 team fouls allowed Vermillion to make nine of 16 free throws for 56 percent.



Groton Area finishes it season with a 19-6 record while Vermillion is 16-9.












